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Reconceptualizing the hyporheic zone for non-perennial rivers and streams

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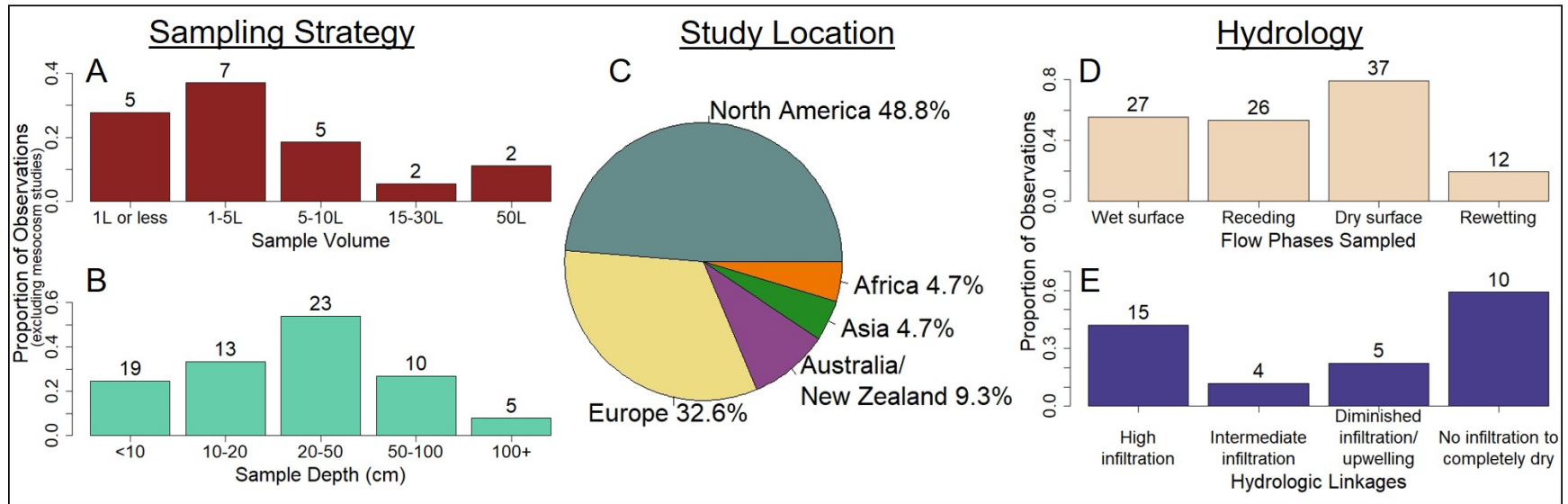

Sampling strategies from prior studies (left) are summarized by the volume of sample taken (A) and the depth/s sampled (B); the percentage of studies by geographic location (C); and the underlying hydrology of the sample sites investigated (right) by flow phase (D) and groundwater linkage condition (E). Bar height corresponds to the proportion of the individual data points from all studies, and the number of studies represented by each category appears above each bar. None of the data includes mesocosm studies.
